Dr. Villavicencio is an assistant professor in the School of Education at the University of California Irvine. She studies K-12 educational policy and practice that deepen or disrupt inequities for students and families who are marginalized because of race, ethnicity, and immigration status. For nearly a decade, she conducted research at the Research Alliance for New York City Schools at NYU—a research-practice partnership with the NYC Department of Education. She is the author of the award-winning book, *Am I My Brother's Keeper: Educational Opportunities and Outcomes for Black and Brown Boys* (Harvard Education Press). Prior to becoming a researcher, Dr. Villavicencio taught middle and high school English in Brooklyn, New York and Oakland, California.
