Contributing to equity, inclusion, and access to care for the Medicare population

Services Addressing Health-Related Social Needs (Community Health Integration Services, Social Determinants of Health Risk Assessment, and Principal Illness Navigation Services)

The services described by the proposed codes are the first that are specifically designed to include **community health workers** (CHW), **care navigators** (CN), and **peer support specialists** (PSS).

In Health-Related Social Needs you will find:

- Community Health Integration (CHI) is CHW-specific
- Principal Illness Navigation (PIN) is PSS- and CN-specific
- Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Risk Assessment covers all of the above workforce categories

CHI and PIN both help to better understand:

- the patient's life story
- ➤ care coordination
- contextualizing health education
- building patient self-advocacy skills
- health system navigation, facilitating behavioral change

- providing social and emotional support, and
- facilitating access to community-based social services to address unmet social determinations of health (SDOH) needs

The SDOH risk assessments assess unmet social needs that may impact the provider's ability to treat the patient.

Community Health Integration (CHI) section:

- Whether it would be appropriate to specify the number of hours of required training, as well as the training content and who should provide the training
- Confirm CMS's understanding of where and how these services would be typically provided (e.g., in-person, audio-video, two-way audio)
- Whether CMS should require patient consent for CHI services
- Whether states typically cover services similar to CHI under their Medicaid programs, and whether such coverage would be duplicative of the CHI service codes
- Whether there are other service elements not included in the proposed CHI service codes that should be included or are important in addressing unmet SDOH need(s) that affect the diagnosis or treatment of medical problems, where CMS should consider coding and payment in the future

Principal Illness Navigation (PIN) section:

- The number of hours of training required, as well as the training content and who should provide the training
- Confirm CMS's understanding of where and how PIN services would be typically provided (for example, with or without direct patient contact, in-person, using audio-video, using two-way audio; and whether navigators are typically local to the patient)
- Whether CMS should require patient consent for PIN services
- Whether states typically cover services similar to PIN under their Medicaid programs, and whether such coverage would be duplicative of the PIN service codes
- Are there other service elements not included in the PIN service codes that are part of associated care that should be included in the PIN service codes, or are important in navigation for high-risk conditions, where CMS should consider coding and payment in the future

Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) Risk Assessment section

- Whether CMS should require as a condition of payment for SDOH risk assessment that the billing practitioner also have the capacity to furnish CHI, PIN, or other care management services, or have partnerships with community-based organizations (CBO) to address identified SDOH needs
- Comments on where and how these services would be typically provided, along with other aspects of the proposed SDOH assessment service

Submitting Your Public Comment



How do I submit a comment on **Regulations.gov**? An overview with screenshots to follow

- The "Comment" button can be found on the following pages:
 - Docket Details page when a document within the docket is open for comment,
 - Document Details page when the document is open for comment, and
 - Document Search Tab with all search results open for comment displaying a "Comment" button.
- Clicking "Comment" on any of the above pages will display the comment form. You can enter your comment on the form and attach files (maximum of 20 files up to 10MB each).
- Choose whether to identify yourself as an individual, an organization, or anonymously. Be sure to complete all
 required fields depending on which identity you have chosen. Please note that information entered on the web form
 may be viewable publicly.
- Once you have completed all required fields and chosen your identity, the "Submit Comment" button is enabled.
- Upon completion, you will receive a Comment Tracking Number for your comment.
- <u>Some agencies also accept comments by mail, fax, or email</u>. To find out if you can use one of these alternate methods, visit the document's section labeled "Addresses."
- Users cannot submit comments on documents published by Non-Participating Agencies.
