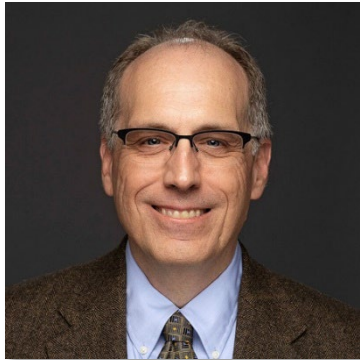


Presenter Bios: The Power of Data in Supporting Recovery High Schools
